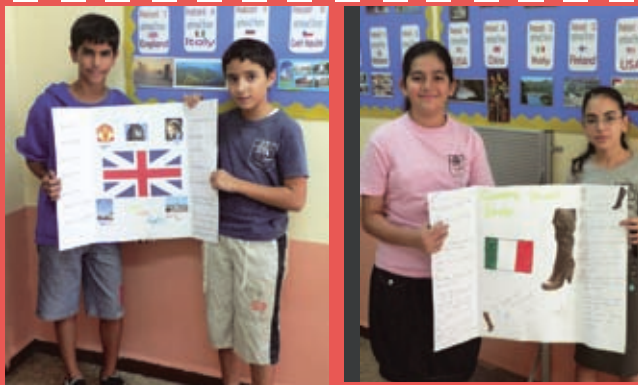


Postcards Project 2010-2011

Tu B'Shvat

Tu B'Shvat is "The New Year For the Trees" and is celebrated on the fifteenth day of the Hebrew month of Shvat.

This Year (2011), Tu (the 15th) B'Shvat, New Year of the Trees is on Thursday, Jan 20.

We eat fruits and nuts on Tu B'Shvat. We especially try to eat the fruits for which the Torah praises the Land of Israel. The Torah describes the Land of Israel as a good land "a land of... vines, figs, and pomegranates... olives and sweet dates".

So on Tu B'Shvat we eat grapes, figs, pomegranates, olives and dates.

How do we celebrate

Tu B'Shvat?

-We sing songs

-We plant trees.

-We eat fruit and nuts, especially the ones that grow in Israel.

-We enjoy eating dried fruit and nuts.

Tu B'Shvat is a happy and important holiday.

It reminds us of our love for the Land of Israel.

We remember that trees help to protect the planet Earth!

They give us beauty, shade, food and oxygen!



Carmel Fire

On Tu B'Shvat we will think about the Carmel fire. The fire was a horrible disaster for all Israeli people.

The fire took place on Mount Carmel. It started on the 2nd Hanukkah candle from the 2nd until the 6th of December.

The fire burnt 5 million trees. 44 people died in the fire. Many firefighters and policemen came to Mount Carmel to put out the fire. Many countries sent Israel

their help.

It was the worst fire disaster in Israel's history.

We will not forget this day because it's a national tragedy.



English From The 1st Grade

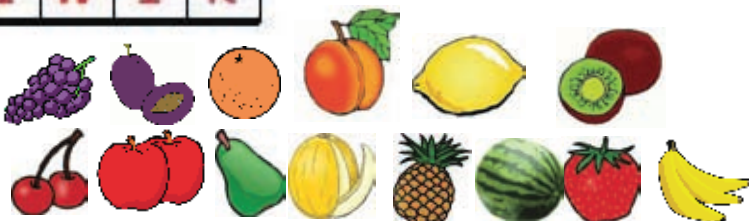
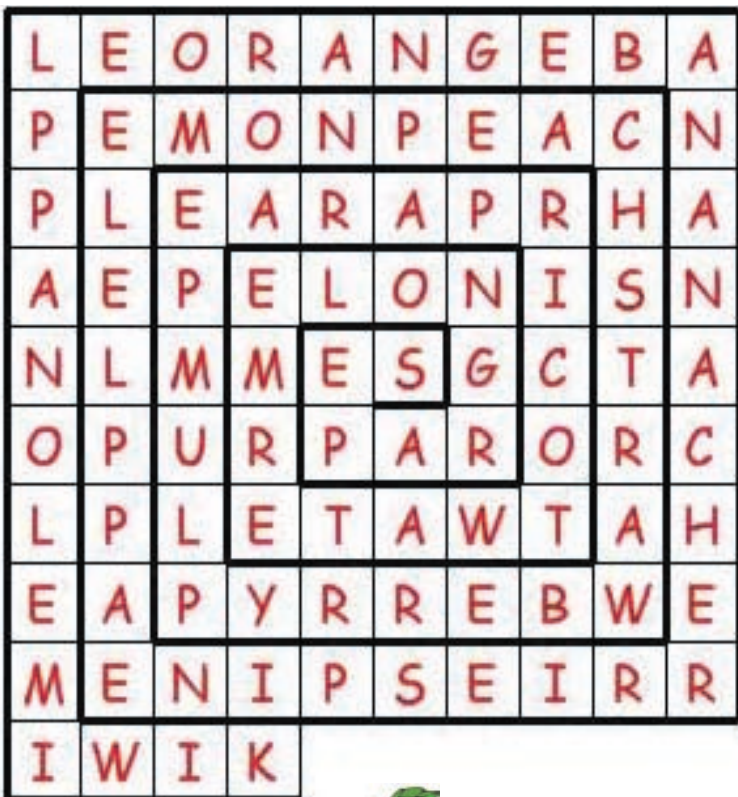
In our school the pupils study English from the 1st grade. They learn the language through games, songs and role plays.
