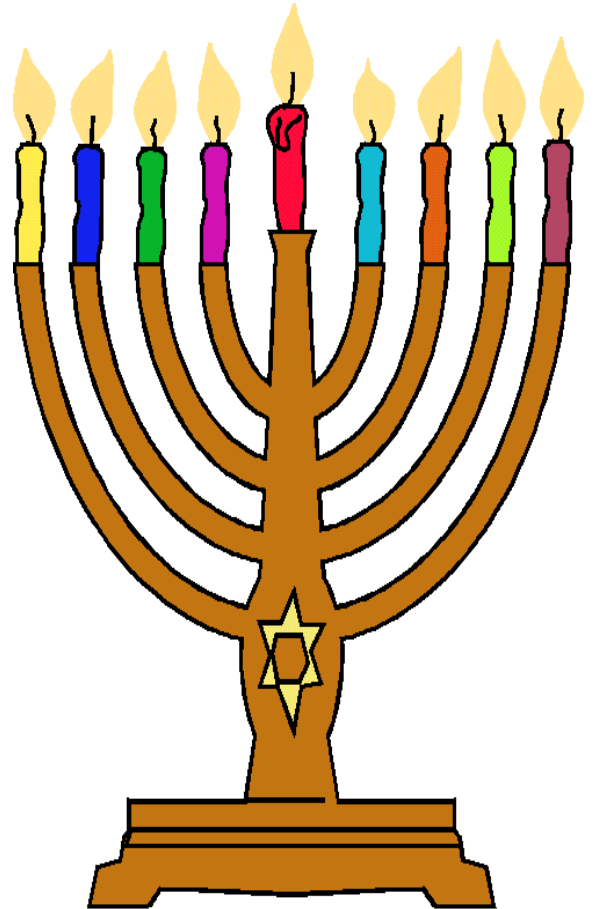

- **Read about Hanukah:**

Hanukah is also known as a festival of lights.

Hanukah begins on the 25th day of the Hebrew month of Kislev.

Hanukah is celebrated by lighting of a candle on the Menorah.

There are eight candles, one for each night of Hanukah.

Eight candles represent the days the oil of the temple lamp lasted.

A menorah is lit on all eight nights of Hanukah to remind us of the ancient temple in Jerusalem.

The ninth candle is Shames. It is a helping candle.

The time for lighting the Menorah is at nightfall, when the stars come out.

In Israel families celebrate Hanukah at home.

They give and receive gifts, decorate the house, meet friends, eat special meals, sing Hanukah songs, and light candles.

Children don't go to school on Hanukah. They have Hanukah holidays.

All the children love Hanukah holidays.

There is a tradition to play with a "dreidel" on Hanukah. A dreidel is a four-sided top with Hebrew letters on each side.

These letters stand for the sentence: "*Nes Gadol Haya Sham*", which means

"A Great Miracle Happened There."

Hanukah is a wonderful and happy holiday.
